Revolutionary War Biography Bottle Project Final Project Due May 21, 2019

There were many important people during the Revolutionary War era. This is your opportunity to learn more about one of these interesting people. The steps are below. The written report will be taken as a summative (test) grade and the bottle will be taken as a formative grade.

Step 1: Choose a Revolutionary War person from the list provided. Research and find out what this person contributed to the time period of the Revolutionary War using the research sheet attached. Time will be spent for research in school. You must include a bibliography that has at least 2 sources.

Step 2: Make a biography bottle to go with your Revolutionary War person. You will need an empty two-liter bottle, some sand or gravel to anchor the bottle, and a Styrofoam ball for the head. The Styrofoam ball can be purchased at craft stores such as Michael's or Hobby Lobby, and sometimes Wal-Mart. Decorate the bottle to represent the person using yarn, felt, paper, or any other materials you choose. Be sure to add details that will make the bottle more accurate. Let me know if you need a 2-Liter bottle.

<u>Step 3</u>: Write a report sharing the information that you learned about the person you choose.

The paper should be

- 1-2 pages in length
- written neatly by hand or typed
- written in your own words
- organized into at least **three** good paragraphs with topic sentences

spelled correctly

Step 4: All students will present his or her biography bottle and paper to the class in a 'gallery walk' style.
